Main characteristics/features

The Bannang Sata Saba Banana (Gluay Hin Bannang Sata) is grown in the Yala province. It has a thick skin, firm flesh and a slightly sour taste. The term 'Gluay Hin', which means 'Rock Banana', comes from its firm flesh. In the past, the Bannang Sata Saba Banana was grown on land with pebbles or gravel.

The Bannang Sata Saba Banana is grown in Yala province, one of the most southern provinces of Thailand.

Link between product and territory

Unlike the other provinces in the south of Thailand, Yala is a landlocked province. It has long and high mountain ranges through which the Pattani River runs. With only two seasons a year, summer and the rainy season, Yala has a rather humid climate and land. These factors that contribute to the existence of its famous Bannang Sata Saba Banana.
