#### Main characteristics/features

Bang Krang Wrapped Santol (Kathon Hor Bangkrang) is grown in Nonthaburi province. It has soft yellow skin, is firm at touch and is sweet with fluffy and cotton-like pulp.

It is grown using the traditional methods of the Bangkrang people. When the Santals mature, the farmers wrap the santals with dried banana leaves or paper to prevent pest damage and to make their skin beautifully yellow.

#### Geographical area

Nonthaburi province, is a fast growing residential area just next to Bangkok once famous for its fruit plantation sites.

#### Production/processing

As the fruit turns yellow signalling that it is nearly ready for harvest, farmers will wrap the whole fruit with dried banana leave or a piece of paper to prevent pest and insect damage. This is why the skin of the fruit is beautifully yellow when it reaches market.

#### Link between product and territory

Nonthaburi has a fertile alluvial soil ideal for fruit bearing trees. The weather is stable throughout the year. These factors contribute to the growth of high quality fruits including santols.
