Main characteristics/features

The Phayao Mae Chai lychee (Lin Chee Mae Chai Phayao) refers to the Hong Huai variety of lychee, which is grown in the Phayao province of Thailand. The fruit is large and oval in shape and has a thin pinky-red peel with short wide prickles. The flesh is cloudy in colour and quite dry and crispy with a sweet taste and fragrant scent.

Phayao Mae Chai lychees are grown in Mae Chai district, Phayao province.

Production/processing

Link between product and territory

Mae Chai district is in the north-western part of Phayao province. It is the originating point of a number of rivers, which all run into Lake Phayao (Kwan Phayao), the province's main source of fresh water. It also contains high levels of potassium and natural fertilisers. The area has three seasons, namely: summer, rainy and winter. The uniqueness of the lychees grown in the areas attributable to all of these factors.
